As Christmas nears, no matter how old we are, there a mysterious magic of Santa Claus with his eight reindeers.


Anne and I would like to wish everyone of you a very Merry Christmas and a healthy and prosperous New Year. Paul Rochon

It was announced at an EODL meeting last week, that there will be a Full-Length Festival in 2022. It will include the performances that were adjudicated prior to the pandemic. The same adjudicator will now adjudicate an additional five theatre group performances. The festival will be called the 2019-2022 Full Length Festival.

Since Theatre Ontario no longer exists, EODL is reaching out to the other three drama leagues in Ontario to continue the Full Act Festival that Theatre Ontario had started many years ago. In the past this festival featured the Best Production play from each of the four drama leagues' Full-Length Festivals. The provincial festival was hosted by each drama league on a rotating basis. 
