Also for those of you who are attending the EODL, directions below are to the **new** Domino Theatre. Paul Rochon used these already, and says they are fantastic...

Directions to the New Domino Theatre

1. Take Highway 401 to Exit 615 which is “Sir John A. MacDonald Boulevard”. (Sir John A.).
2. Proceed south on “Sir John A” for 5.5 km to “Union Street”.
3. Turn right onto “Union Street” and proceed 0.5 km to “Church Street”.
4. Bear right of a small traffic island onto Baiden Street and immediately turn right onto “Church Street”.
5. Proceed 0.1 km to destination on the left. “Harold Harvey Centre”. Parking is on the street or in the lot beside the building. Use the main doors facing the street.

GPS and MapQuest Location:

Note: there is a mapping problem with the street name in MapQuest and some GPS units such as “Garmin”. If your unit does not recognize 52 Church Street, then try setting your destination to 41 Church Street and if the unit still cannot find the location, then reset the destination to 41 Harrowsmith Church Street in Kingston Ontario. #41 is the Anglican Church directly across the street from the theatre.
